## ■ *Congressional findings*

### **Food Safety Session**

- The HACCP system of self control is a useful tool to monitor the safety of the feed looking for a flexible approach, focusing on the training of all operators in the food chain and those responsible for animal control officer.
- The use of code of good practice is a valuable tool in supporting the sector to meet rules on feed hygiene.
- Cross-contamination in feed mills is inevitable, the solutions pass through greater specialization and planning the manufacture of medicated feedingstuffs and the development of new methodologies for applying the final mixes of the production line.
- Transparency and more information on GMOs: the impact on food security, social and environmental impact for the consumer to take a stance and making a purchase .

### **Session Materials Markets**

- The movements of prices of raw materials in the international market: price volatility and instability of markets: rising in the short and medium term. There is the possibility of a new bubble in the market similar to 2007.
- The information will be key in the future decision-making in the purchase of raw materials
- Development of biofuels with new perspectives for the use of by-products in animal feed: glycerin, DDGs, and so on.

### **Innovation Session**

- From the standpoint of innovation, it is necessary to design feeding strategies to optimize the efficient use of nutrients and production costs and adding value to products. In this sense, functional foods represent an opportunity, although lack of data and information on its role and optimal levels of consumption.
- The livestock sector has been in recent years, is and will be significant pressure from society, particularly with regard to environmental and food security.
